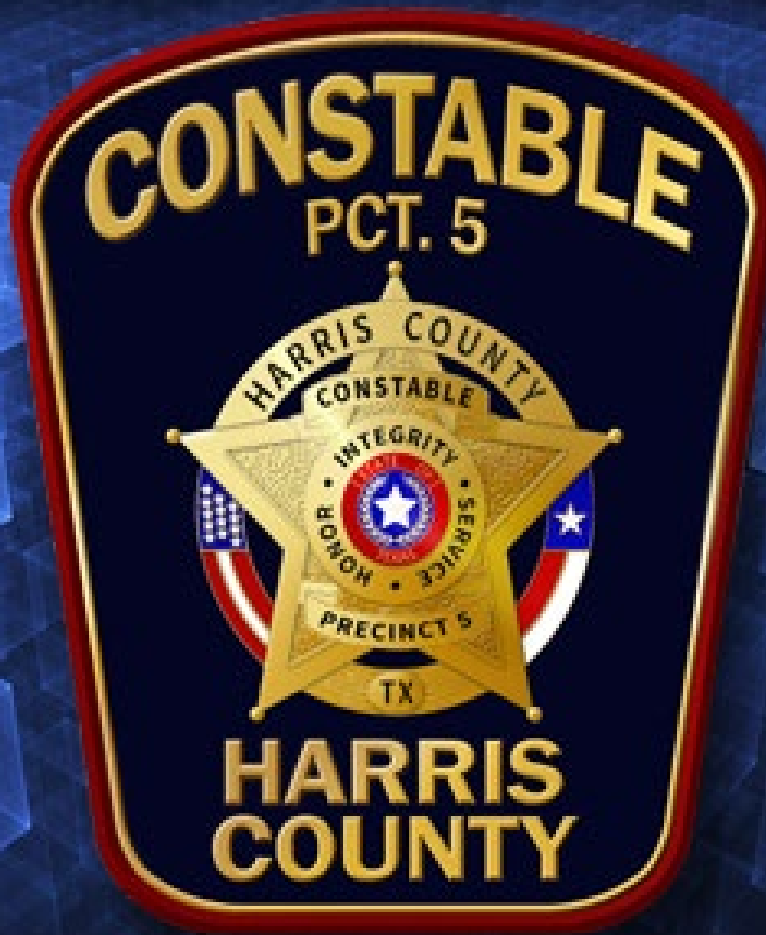

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Greetings,

Attached is the **June 2026 Monthly Safety Report**. During this period, deputies handled a total of **741** calls for service and self-initiated activities.

Based on the numbers in comparison to the month of May, we had an increase in number of calls regarding suspicious vehicles (7 more than last month). After further reviewing the incidents, it's clear that this is a direct result of the community's vigilance with their surroundings. All of the calls were peacefully resolved and deputies concluded that the vehicles were a resident's visitor or service providers (city workers, landscapers, company repairmen, etc).

I'd like to thank the residents for their observations and proactive assistance on these matters as they directly influence the deterrence of crime. We encourage everyone to continue contacting our dispatch should they find any suspicious activity or have concerns regarding the neighborhood.

We also had 1 report of a stolen vehicle - a resident's golf cart. The resident utilized their golf cart to visit a business near the Katy Fwy service road and a suspect took the golf cart while it was unattended. I'm happy to report that the quick response from deputies allowed them to recover the golf cart that same night.

We also had 1 Assault report. After gathering the resident's statement, it was determined that the assault took place at the Memorial City Mall parking garage. The resident did not incur any injuries and did not wish to press charges.

This month our deputies have also initiated contact with a couple E-bike riders and electric unicycle riders that were in violation of traffic laws. We encourage residents to inform their children of the bicycle laws and how they apply to the city streets. We will be including E-bike information in the upcoming monthly safety reports to help ensure the children stay safe while having fun.

I'd like to conclude with providing you all with our monthly statistics below.

In **June 2026**, we investigated:

- 442 Contract Checks, including park & neighborhood checks
- 29 Meet the Citizens
- 113 Vacation Watches

- 1 Burglary Motor Vehicles (vehicle was unlocked while parked on the street - nothing was stolen/damaged)
- 1 Assault (occurred within Memorial City Mall property)
- 68 Traffic Stops
- 3 Arrests (resulted from Traffic Stops)
- 1 Stolen Vehicle (golf cart stolen and quickly recovered)
- 3 Suspicious Persons
- 12 Suspicious Vehicles
- 3 Disturbances/Loud Noise
- 3 Local Alarms (false alarms)
- 3 Crashes

Personal Safety Tips

Please make sure you close your car garages when unattended or not in use as well as lock all unattended vehicles.

If you notice **anyone acting suspiciously or unfamiliar individuals** in your neighborhood, **call dispatch immediately**. Getting to know your neighbors can also help keep the community safe.

If you believe you are being followed, **do not drive home**—instead, **call 911** and have dispatch direct you to the **nearest police substation**.

More safety tips

- If you see something – *say something*. Call our dispatch center to report incidents: (281) 463-6666.
- Remember: When you call for a law enforcement / emergency response, please understand that our dispatchers require as much information as possible. The reason for this is so that the responding deputies have as much background on the incident and the caller as possible. It helps us do our job more effectively and it ultimately means a

more swift response to the incident (whatever it may be). Please be as detailed and thorough as possible.

- Make sure your home address is visible for law enforcement, firefighters, and emergency medical services to be able to identify your location with ease.
- Always arm your home security system when you are away.
- Always lock your car doors when you exit your vehicle.
- Always lock the doors and windows to your home.
- Please remember to keep your dog on a leash (it's the law).
- Ensure your outside lights are sufficient to keep your home well-lit. This makes it less likely that thieves and burglars will target your home.
- Keep your garage doors closed and locked.
- Make sure your pet door isn't a free entry for a thief. Keep it locked!
- Awareness of your surroundings is important. When you leave a location such as a bank, make sure no one is following you when you leave. If you believe you are being followed, go to a crowded well-lit area (or a police station if you can) and call 9-1-1. Do not go home.
- Solicitors – Be cautious with any stranger that knocks on your door. You are not required to open the door. Never open the door to someone that you don't know. Do not get in a conversation with solicitors through your front door. If you notice the solicitor doing anything suspicious such as looking in windows, testing doors, entering back yards, or any other suspicious behavior, call law enforcement immediately.
- Burglars may check to see if anyone is at home during the day when most people are at work, school, grocery store, etc. This is when most residential burglaries occur. Do NOT open the door to anyone you don't know or aren't comfortable with and don't hesitate to call us.

- Packages – Don't let your packages sit at the front door. Schedule deliveries for times you will be home if possible. If necessary, have a neighbor watch for deliveries you may be expecting.
- Suspicious Persons and or Vehicles – Please do not hesitate to call us so we can investigate. Just because someone is wearing a reflective yellow vest does not make them official. Do not become a victim!

In the event of an Active Shooter / Active Attacker incident, remember these three words: AVOID, DENY, DEFEND.

-AVOID: If possible, avoid the attacker and make an emergency exit if you are within the confines of a building or perimeter.

-DENY: If you are unable to avoid the attacker, then deny them access to your location. Lock and barricade the door of the room you may be in and look for alternate ways to escape.

-DEFEND: If you cannot avoid the attacker or deny them access to your location, then remember: **IT IS YOUR RIGHT** to defend yourself. Be prepared to improvise and use items around you as defensive weapons to stop the attacker.

-Whenever you are able to do so, **call 9-1-1** and give the dispatchers as much information as you can in order to help law enforcement reach you faster.
